[Russian State University for the Humanities \(RSUH\)](#) was created in 1991 as the result of the merger of the Moscow Public University (est. 1908) and the Moscow State Institute for History and Archives (est. 1930). Nowadays RSUH is one of the greatest Russian universities that specialize in such fields as social and humanitarian studies. At RSUH work highly qualified professionals who educate younger generations and carry out both fundamental and applied researches in the field of world-class human knowledge.

RSUH currently comprises seven institutes, eleven faculties, nineteen scientific and educational centers, eight laboratories, and fifty departments. Its principal subdivisions are as follows:

- Archives School
- Institute of Economics, Management and Law (including the Faculty of Management, the Faculty of Economics, and the Faculty of Law)
- L. S. Vygotsky Institute of Psychology
- Institute of Mass Media
- Institute of Linguistics (including the Department of Linguistics, and the Department of Intellectual Systems)
- Institute of Information Sciences and Security Technologies
- Historical-Philological Institute
- Institute for Oriental and Classical Studies
- Institute of New Educational Technologies
- Russian Anthropologic School.

[Institute for Oriental Studies](#) (since 2003 – Institute for Oriental and Classical Studies) was created in 1994 as a special Institute combining both education and scientific researches. Nowadays in Institute for Oriental and Classical Studies students learn a wide range of disciplines that give a deep understanding of Oriental languages and Oriental culture. During the study students work directly with manuscripts, and this is also one of the important features of Institute for Oriental and Classical Studies that has no analogue in Russia.
